**Commission Regulation (EU) 2015/1222 of 24 July 2015 establishing a Guideline on Capacity Allocation and Congestion Management (CACM) Notification Pursuant to Article 4(5)**

On 17 January 2017, in line with Article 4(5) of the Regulation establishing a Guideline on Capacity Allocation and Congestion Management (CACM)<sup>1</sup>, the Commission for Energy Regulation (CER) received the formal notification of Nord Pool to operate as Nominated Electricity Market Operator (NEMO) in Ireland.

The CER welcomes Nord Pool's request to offer day-ahead and intraday trading services in Ireland. The CER notes that Nord Pool operates across a range of European countries and is designated as a NEMO in several member states of the European Union.

The CER has reviewed the notification in line with the requirements of the CACM regulation and in line with the CER's statutory duties and obligations. On that basis, the CER considers that the Nord Pool's notification meets the requirements set out in the CACM Regulation with regard to NEMOs designation.

**Next Steps**

In line with CACM, Article 45 and 57, the CER will contact the Irish Transmission System Operator and request them to develop a proposal for multi-NEMO arrangements for the day-ahead and intraday electricity market coupling in Ireland.
