Re: All-island Generator Transmission Use of System (TUoS) charging

The Consumer Council is a Non-Departmental Public Body set up in legislation to safeguard the interests of all consumers, and particularly the vulnerable and disadvantaged. The Consumer Council is an independent organisation which operates to promote and protect the consumer interest.

We welcome the opportunity to respond to this consultation on the all-island generator Transmission Use of System (TUoS) charging.

With fuel poverty levels in Northern Ireland at 44 per cent, many households are struggling to adequately heat their home, it is important that the regulatory structures look to minimise the cost of energy to consumers.

The Consumer Council believes that any decision on all-island generator TUoS charging must be taken in the interest of all consumers. Any changes to the current procedure should only be undertaken if they will benefit all consumers. The benefits for all consumers will ultimately be realised through lower final bills.

It is important that any decisions on any of the four issues take into consideration the overall impact on the final bills charged to consumers. Ultimately any changes should aim to improve the economic efficiency of all generators and suppliers in the all-island market, which will provide benefits for consumers in the form of lower bills.
